Dr Craig Bourne: ケンブリッジ大学 Pembroke College にて哲学専攻。2002 年 ~2006 年ケンブリッジ大学 St. Catharine's College の研究員、2007 年からは Hertfordshire 大学にて哲学科上級講師を務める。

Dr Emily Caddick: ケンブリッジ大学 Newnham College 哲学科を 2007 年に卒業、2011 年 PhD。現在、ケンブリッジ大学の Institute of Continuing Education にてアカデミック・ディレクターを務める。

There will be a lecture on "The Philosophy of Macbeth" by Dr Craig Bourne and Dr Emily Caddick. They will discuss philosophical issues but the lecture will be understandable by a general audience so please feel free to join us! (The lecture will be in English.)

Macbeth encounters three strange women who tell him that he will become Thane of Cawdor and then King of Scotland. When Macbeth is made Thane of Cawdor, he and his wife are hopeful that the women have the ability to know the future. Driven by the prospect of becoming King of Scotland, Macbeth murders King Duncan, but spends the rest of his life in fear of losing the throne and of what else his future holds. Philosophical themes of fate, foreknowledge, freedom and responsibility are central to Macbeth, and philosophical reflection on these themes gives us a better understanding of the events of the play. Are the three women witches with knowledge of the future? How does this affect whether Macbeth is responsible for what he does? Could Macbeth have chosen a different future? In this lecture, we will provide a way of tackling these questions and give what we think are the right answers.

Dr Craig Bourne went to Pembroke College, University of Cambridge (1995-1998) and took a BA in Philosophy. In 1999, he began a BSc (Hons) degree in Mathematics and Physics. His PhD thesis (1999-2002) – *A Defence of Presentism* – investigates the nature of time. From 2002 to 2006, he was a Research Fellow at St. Catherine's College and since October 2007 he has been Senior Lecturer in Philosophy at the University of Hertfordshire.

Dr Emily Caddick is Academic Director and Teaching Officer in Philosophy at ICE (Institute of Continuing Education), affiliated with the University of Cambridge, Faculty of Philosophy. She completed her BA in Philosophy at Newnham College, Cambridge in 2007. She stayed at Newnham to take an MPhil (2007-8) and PhD (2008-11).
